From the Canal Dredge Project Manager-Update

A lot has happened since the last update. Our contractor decided to attempt a different methodology to dewater the dredge slurry. The new method involves the use of geo-tubes. This change does involve a minor modification to our CAMA permit which is being prepared, by our contractor, at this time.

The Deltanks have been removed. The site is being reshaped to accommodate the geo-tubes. Unfortunately, the dredge moratorium goes into effect on February 14. So, even if this method proves successful, we will have only a few days to dredge unless we are granted an extension.

At a meeting this past Saturday, the Town Council agreed to the request to modify the permit, subject to a number of conditions - most of which have been met. The SSCA has been more than cooperative in their support of the project and their willingness to help make it happen. A special thank you to Karen Kranda and her Board.

Request for Proposal

The Town of Southern Shores is seeking proposals for participation in the third year of the Shoreline Management Project. Proposals should include for sand fencing per CAMA requirements of erection and/or planting of dune grass.

The scope of the work includes proposals for removal of old damaged sand fencing and erection of new fencing along the entire Southern Shores oceanfront between March 1, 2010 and March 31, 2010. The proposal for planting of dune grass between the fencing may be a separate bid or combined with the fencing bid.

All contractors wishing to submit bids may submit their bids to Patricia Forrester, Permit Officer, 5375 N. Virginia Dare Trl, Southern Shores NC 27949, Fax 252-255-0876. Contractors are required to submit a copy of their insurance/bond, a copy of evidence that they are covered by Workmen's Compensation as required by the State of North Carolina,

Proposals submitted without the required information will not be considered. All proposals shall be received no later than February 19, 2010 and all bids will be opened at 10:00 am on Monday, February 22, 2010 at the Southern Shores Town Hall.
