From the Canal Dredge Project Manager – Update

Work continues at the North Marina. Gravel has been placed in both the upper and lower level parking areas. On the lower level, we have increased the available parking by at least three spaces. Grading, seeding and mulching should be finished by the weekend. Barring any unavoidable delay, our ramp will be open before April 1.

We do have some additional work to complete near the entrance, and some replacement landscaping for Ted and Carole Greene; their mailbox has been removed and replaced at least four times. They have shown exemplary patience throughout this process. Their cooperation and positive attitude are much appreciated.
