



This digital Flood Insurance Rate Map (FIRM) was produced through cooperative partnership between the State of North Carolina and the Emergency Management Agency (EMA). The State of North Carolina implemented a long-term approach to floodplain management to decrease losses associated with flooding. This is demonstrated by the State's use of flood hazard areas at the local level. As a part of this effort, the North Carolina has entered into a Cooperative Technical State agreement (FEMA) to produce and maintain the digital FIRM.

To maintain accreditation, the levee owner or community is required to submit the data and documentation necessary to comply with Section 65.10 of the NFIP regulations. If the community or owner does not provide the necessary data and documentation or if the data and documentation provided indicate the levee system does not comply with Section 65.10 requirements, FEMA will remove the flood hazard and risk information for the area to reflect de-accreditation of the levee system. 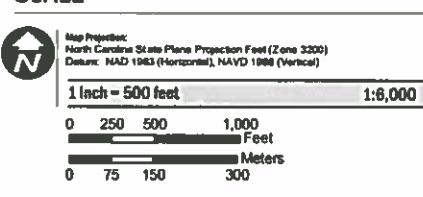
PROVISIONALLY ACCREDITED LEVEE NOTES TO USERS: If a Provisionally Accredited Levee (PAL) note appears on the panel, check with your local community to obtain more information, such as the estimated level of protection provided (which may exceed the 1 percent annual-chance level) and Emergency Action Plan, or the levee system (s) shown on providing protection. To maintain accreditation, the levee owner or community is required to submit the data and documentation necessary to comply with Section 65.10 of the NFIP regulations. If the community or owner does not provide the necessary data and documentation or if the data and documentation provided indicate the levee system does not comply with Section 65.10 requirements, FEMA will remove the flood hazard and risk information for the area to reflect de-accreditation of the levee system. LIMIT OF MODERATE WAVE ACTION NOTES TO USERS: For some coastal flooding about the AE Zone category has been divided by a Limit of Moderate Wave Action (LIMWA). The LIMWA represents the approximate seaward limit of the 1-foot breaking wave. The effects of wave heights between the VE Zone and the LIMWA (if between the shoreline and the LIMWA for areas where VE Zones are not identified) will be similar to, but less severe than those in the VE Zone.

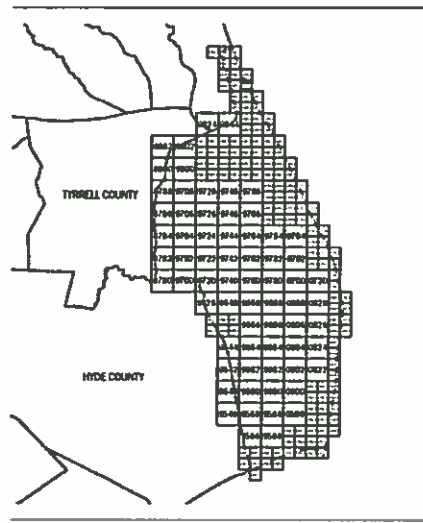
COASTAL BARRIER RESOURCES SYSTEM (CBRS) NOTE
