









Traffic Violation Citations & Warnings









Chief's Statement

2013 was a productive and busy year for our officers. We saw an increase in calls for service compared to last year. The most notable increases were assisting other agencies, foot patrols and extra patrols. We also experienced a slight increase in "reported" crimes which lead to an increase in our criminal arrests for the year. Officers responded to an average of 1,000 calls for service per month. The month of May was the busiest with 1122 calls for service while June through October all had just over 1000 calls for service each. February turned out to be the slowest month with 807 calls for service. We continue to see a significant increase in traffic enforcement; officers issued nearly twice the number of written citations and warning citations than the previous year. We experienced a decrease in motor vehicle accidents compared to last year. Our officers continued to provide the highest standard of professional service to the community.

Officers continue to be proactive by patrolling the neighborhoods and increasing their foot patrols this year, which resulted in the officers getting out of the patrol cars more frequently and walking the business districts.

We held our 6th Annual Awards Ceremony; Corporal Darrell Brickhouse was nominated by his peers as "Officer of the Year". This is Corporal Brickhouse's second time receiving this award. This truly speaks volumes for the dedication and hard work that he puts into his job every day. I commend him for his outstanding performance throughout the year. Our newest officer, Ryan Jones has evolved into an excellent police officer and is a great asset to our department and community.

We continue to train; this year was no exception. We conducted several "Active Shooter" training segments at Kitty Hawk Elementary School; that included joint training with Kitty Hawk Police department.

I would like to personally thank all the members of the police department for the hard work and dedication each of them exhibits on a daily basis. I would also like to thank the Town Manager for his sincere support and assistance as well as the Town Council and Community for their continued support.


