2018 showed a continued increase in calls for service over the prior years. Some factors that attributed to this were additional business and residence checks, as well as, additional school patrol walkthroughs and community policing activities which included officers stopping to talk/interac with residents and visitors daily. The month of August proved to be the busiest "summer" month. Officers responded to an average of 1450 calls for service per month. The total number of motor vehicle accidents increased slightly compared to last year. July continues to be the highest month for reportable traffic accidents with a total of 13 and April being the lowest with 1 traffic accident. The highest traffic accident location continues to be Duck Rd. with 22 and the time of day with the highest number of traffic accidents was between 10am and 2pm with a total of 23 crashes. Reported crimes show a slight decrease compared to last year and a 13% decrease in criminal arrests. Traffic citations issued showed a slight increase and written warning citations saw a decrease compared to last year.

It is important to note that even though we saw reductions in some areas of enforcement, we were short one police officer during the summer months. Even with the shortage of manpower through most of the summer season, officers continued to provide exceptional police services to both the residents and vacationing visitors. Officer Tracy Mann, our School Resource Officer, continues to interact with the students and staff daily, which includes teaching classes regarding anti-bullying and internet safety as well as being another resource for the teachers to utilize. Officer Mann spends countless hours of her own time assisting and participating in numerous after-school programs throughout the school year. Officer Mann continues to teach Drug Abuse Resistance Education and several hundred children have successfully graduated from this class over the last three years. Officer Mann is assigned to patrol in the summer months when school is in recess. This time provides her the opportunity to attend training and update her required certifications, that she is unable to complete during the school year. Patrol officers also visit and walk through the school daily. Officers continue to be proactive by patrolling the neighborhoods and increasing their foot patrols which result in the officers getting out of the patrol cars more frequently and walking the business districts.

We continue to train and educate our officers; this year was no exception. We conducted several "Active Shooter" training segments at Kitty Hawk Elementary School that included joint training with Kitty Hawk Police Department, Duck Police Department and Southern Shores Volunteer Fire Department. We also continue working with the new School Superintendent and have addressed issues we had regarding Kitty Hawk Elementary School. The outcome of these meetings has been very positive.

I would like to personally thank all the members of the police department for the hard work and dedication each of them exhibits day, and a special thanks to our Administrative Assistant Jennifer Couture for assisting in putting this report together. I would also like to thank the Town Manager for his sincere support and assistance as well as the Town Council and Community for their continued support.



2018 In-Service Training









Officers continue to conduct training at Kitty Hawk Elementary School during the summer months and during Spring Break each year. This year was no exception.




