# 2020 Annual Report



#### **Chief's Statement**

2020 proved to be a very challenging year, not only for us but for the entire world, with the onset of COVID 19. The Town of Southern Shores is and continues to be very fortunate to have the high-quality dedicated police officers that it has. We continued to respond to all calls for services throughout the pandemic. We scrambled to find and obtain any PPE equipment we could get our hands on to better protect our officers. This proved to be a significant challenge that we eventually overcame. By the end of the year, we saw an increase of over 3500 calls for service compared to 2019. Officers responded to an average of 1705 calls for service per month compared to 1410 last year. Some of the higher volume of calls for service were for business and house checks, we also saw a significant increase in extra patrols, which were saturation patrols directed in our neighborhoods during the peak of the pandemic lock down trying to reassure our residence that we were still out there providing our services. Officers responded to a total of 108 Motor Vehicle Accidents, 75 of them were reportable. This is a 35% increase over last year. July was the highest month for reportable traffic accidents with a total of 13, June & August were 2<sup>nd</sup> & 3<sup>rd</sup> respectively with 12, & 10. and February was the lowest with "0". The highest traffic accident location continues to be (NC12) Duck Rd. with 24. The time of day with the highest number of traffic accidents was between 10am and 4pm with a total of 33 crashes. Reported crimes reflect an increase of approximately 55% compared to last year and a 70% increase in Offenses charged. Two of the most significant increases were Drug and DWI's arrests. Traffic citations issued also reflect a large increase (40%) over 2019. One of the increases was speeding violations which increased from 180 in 2019 to 230 in 2020. There were another 226 warning citations issued for speeding as well. While we had no officially documented COVID19 cases amongst the officers, we did have numerous officers that had to quarantine 14 days at a time at different times throughout the pandemic. The fact that there was no in-person school for most of the school year, allowed our School Resource Officer to work a regular shift helping to alleviate some of the workload and cover shifts.

99.9% of all in-person training was cancelled throughout the state this year. Officers were still able to complete their mandated in-service training and other limited specialty virtual training on-line. We continued to keep up to date on "Active Shooter" training and techniques, we continue to train physically, defensively, this includes firearms training, as well as defensive tactics, most of which was done utilizing social distancing and/or virtual training options.

I would like to personally thank all the members of the police department for the hard work and dedication they exhibit each day, and a special thanks to our Administrative Assistant Jennifer Couture for assisting in putting this report together. I would also like to thank the Town Manager for his support and assistance as well as the Town Council and Community for their continued support.




#### Incidents/Crimes Reported

Incident - one or more offenses committed by
the same offender, or group of offenders acting
in concert, at the same time and place.

Offense - all crimes that have occurred within a single incident with which an offender may be charged.

Example: Police may be called to a residence in which someone broke into a home to commit a theft and in the process assaulted the homeowner and upon fleeing stole a car. This is reported as one incident in which three separate offenses occurred.


#### Criminal Arrests / Charges

Arrest - the physical detainment of an individual suspected of violating criminal laws. Multiple offenses from one or more incidents may be charged in the course of one arrest.

Charges - the separate offenses in which a suspect in charged with for violation of criminal laws during an arrest.

Example: Police arrest John Doe for Breaking & Entering. There were three charges for Breaking & Entering as well as charges for Larceny from three separate Incidents, but they were all recorded as one arrest.

#### Criminal Arrests / Charges






The pandemic kept us indoors a good part of the year which meant birthday parties were a no-go. Instead, drive-by parties became a thing!
