

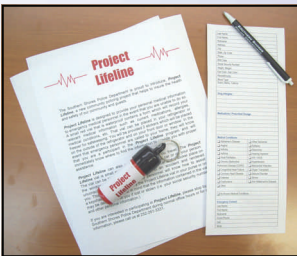

Project Lifeline



Project Lifeline is designed to provide your personal medical information to emergency medical personnel in the event that you are unable to do so. A small red vial that is waterproof contains a form which will record your relevant medical information such as current medications, allergies, medical conditions, etc. That vial can be placed in your refrigerator or freezer for safekeeping. You will be provided 2 stickers which will be placed on the outside of the refrigerator and on your front door or window. In the event that emergency personnel are called to your home, they will know that you are a participant in the *Project Lifeline* program and will immediately know where to find the information to provide you with proper assistance. R U BUCKLED? is an initiative created to encourage safety belt usage among teenage drivers. *R U BUCKLED?* started off in 53 high schools in 16 counties in the fall of 2005. The program requires drivers and passengers at all participating schools to buckle their safety belts before leaving school property or risk losing high school parking privileges. According to the Department of Motor Vehicles, **156** 15-to-19 year olds were killed in North Carolina in 2007 traffic crashes, with 80 of them not wearing their seat belts. Nearly 75,000 students from 240 high schools in over 80 counties will participate in *R U Buckled?* this year.
