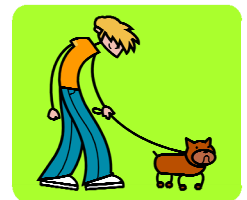

Parking

The parking ordinance in Southern Shores is enforced 24/7 throughout the entire year. This ordinance is NOT seasonal. You must have a current resident parking sticker permanently affixed to your windshield in order to park at the designated beach accesses. Parking stickers may be obtained at the Southern Shores Town Hall, M-F, 8:30 am—5:00 pm. Violation of this ordinance will result in a \$50.00 fine.

NO DOGS ON THE BEACH!

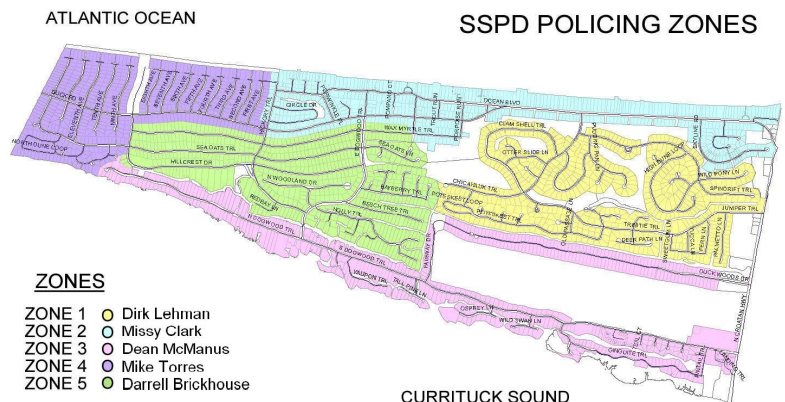
Spring is on the way and this is a reminder that dogs are not allowed on the beach at any time of day after May 15th until September 15th. Any dog that is off its own property must be on a leash. Violation of either the leash law or having a dog on the beach will result in a \$50.00 fine.
