

The digital Flood Insurance Rate Map (FIRM) was produced through a unique cooperative partnership between the State of North Carolina and the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA). The State of North Carolina has implemented a long term approach to floodplain management to decrease the costs associated with flooding. This is accomplished by the State's commitment to map flood hazard areas at the local level. As a part of this effort, the State of North Carolina has entered into a Cooperative Technical State agreement with FEMA to produce and maintain the digital FIRM.

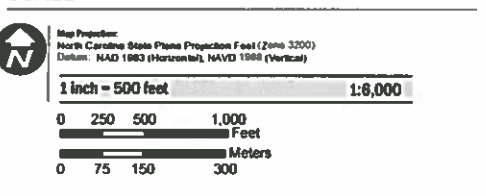
PROVISIONALLY ACCREDITED LEVEE NOTES TO USERS: If a Provisionally Accredited Levee (PAL) rate appears on the panel, check with your local community to obtain more information, such as the estimated level of protection provided (which may exceed the 1 percent annual-chance level) and Emergency Action Plan, on the levee system(s) shown as providing protection. To maintain accreditation, the levee owner or community is required to submit the data and documentation necessary to comply with Section 86.19 of the NFIP regulations. If the community or owner does not provide the necessary data and documentation or if the data and documentation provided indicates the levee system does not comply with Section 86.19 requirements, FEMA will remove the flood hazard and risk information for the area to reflect de-accreditation of the levee system. To mitigate flood risk to residential areas, property owners and residents are encouraged to consider flood insurance and floodproofing or other protective measures. LIMIT OF MODERATE WAVE ACTION NOTES TO USERS: For some coastal flooding zones the AE Zone category has been divided by a Limit of Moderate Wave Action (LIMWA). The LIMWA represents the approximate landward limit of the 3-foot breaking wave. The effects of wave hazards between the VE Zone and the LIMWA (or between the shoreline and the LIMWA for areas where VE Zones are not established) will be similar to, but less severe than those in the VE Zone.

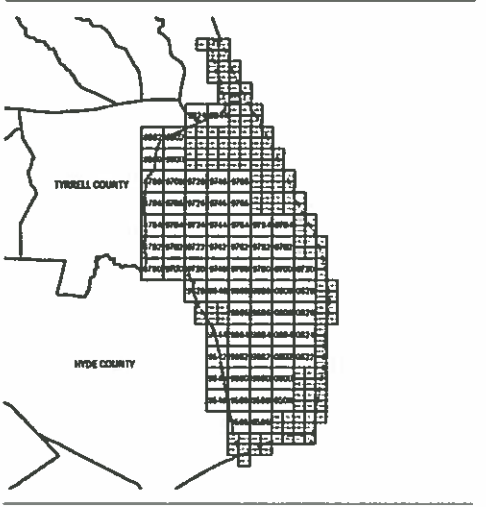
