Council Meeting  
September 5, 2000  
7:30 p.m.-Pitts Center

1. Mayor Sutherland called the meeting to order at 7:30 p.m.
2. Mayor Sutherland led the Pledge of Allegiance.
3. Moment of Silence

Mayor Sutherland asked that a moment of silence be held for the families of Harold Via (long time resident, original town council, mayor pro tem and fire chief), Brad Scherr, (wood carver of the town seal), Philip Brassington, (long time resident), Helen Byrum, (resident) and William Bradna, (a tourist who was fatally injured on the beach at Purple Martin).

Mayor Sutherland announced that Councilman Campbell and Councilman Smith are on vacation but that Council can take limited action by voting on issues not related to ordinances.

He praised the work of the volunteers, Tom Charlton, Bob Siegel, Don and Merrie Smith, Joe Campbell, and all the others that made the Pitts Center the best Council meeting chambers on the beach. He said the new chamber is rated to accommodate 220 people.

4. Consent Agenda

Mayor Sutherland presented the Council minutes of August 1, 2000, the monthly Building Inspections report and a tax authorization allowing the tax collector to collect taxes for the Town. Councilman Kennedy made a motion to adopt the consent agenda as presented. Councilman Denny seconded. Approved unanimously.

5. Planning Board

Chairman Morrison presented monthly report of the 8/21/00 meeting. He reported that the Board would continue working on the draft of the group development on parcels of over 4 acres ordinance. A special meeting will be held on August 29 at 7:00 p.m. to continue the discussion on the telecommunications towers ordinance and a draft will be presented to Council at the October meeting. He announced that the next Planning Board meeting would be held on September 18 at 7:30 p.m. in the Pitts Center. Some of the issues to be discussed will be a site plan submitted from the All Saints Episcopal Church for a shed, Central Garden Landscaping and Nursery requesting a change in parking requirements, and a site plan submitted by Neal Blinken for a proposed retail/restaurant/office.

6. Old Business

a. Personal Watercraft Ordinance (PWC) Amendment

Mayor Sutherland announced that a public hearing would be held on October 3, 2000 at 9:00 a.m. to hear comment on the amended PWC. He explained the changes came about from working with Martin's Point representatives by Councilman Smith and Councilman Campbell. He stated that the Town would still maintain a strong PWC ordinance.

b. Extraterritorial Jurisdiction Status (ETJ)

Mayor Sutherland reported that Council held a special meeting on August 29, 2000 to adopt the amended ETJ ordinance. He explained that the ordinance deleted the residential area of Martin's Point from the planning and zoning jurisdiction of the Town. The Town would maintain planning and zoning jurisdiction over Martin's Point commercial zone and waterway jurisdiction.

Mayor Sutherland presented an Interlocal Agreement between the Town and Dare County regarding the County's planning and zoning takeover of the Martin's Point residential zone. Mayor Sutherland explained that there would be a 60-day time frame for the switch, however; any building permits taken by the Town during the 60 days will be managed until closed by the Town's Building Inspections Department. In addition, all open permits would be similarly managed until closed out. Councilman Denny moved to adopt the agreement and to have the Mayor execute it. Councilman Kennedy seconded. Approved unanimously.

c. Traffic/Bridge

Mayor Sutherland announced that NCDOT would be holding a public meeting on October 4 at 1:00 p.m. in the Pitts Center to discuss a traffic study prepared on NC 12 and US Hwy 158.

He also reported he would be attending a meeting with State representatives and a Currituck County Commissioner regarding the Mid-County Bridge that has been proposed for a long time.

7. New Business

a. Chicahuak Property Owner's Association-Sidewalks

Mayor Sutherland reported that Bruce Green, President, has requested that Council considered taking over the maintenance of their sidewalks/bike paths. Mayor Sutherland suggested that a meeting be scheduled to further discuss this matter. Council agreed.

b. Surplus Property

Mayor Sutherland read the resolution and inventory for surplus. (see attached)  
Councilman Kennedy made a motion to adopt the resolution and inventory list as presented.  
Councilman Denny seconded. Approved unanimously.

New Business cont'd

c. Designation of Applicant's Agent (FEMA)

Mayor Sutherland explained that this an annual form that needs to be approved. Councilman Denny moved to adopt the form to include the agents as being Paul Sutherland, Joe Campbell, and Thomas Gjestson, Town Manager. Councilman Kennedy seconded. Approved unanimously.

d. Lot Disturbance Penalty Fee

Mayor Sutherland explained that the zoning ordinance had been amended by initiating a lot disturbance permit. The Town Building Inspector has two property owners who have violated the ordinance and he now needs Council to set forth a penalty. Mayor Sutherland recommended that this issue be put on the Council's workshop agenda for September 26.

e. Dare County Cable Selection Committee-Joe Campbell

Mayor Sutherland reported that Dare County had proposed to do a study to evaluate Falcon Cable at a cost of \$44,000 and had asked each municipality to share in the cost but Southern Shores declined. Now there is a new cable company, Charter, and the County has agreed to select a committee to evaluate Charter's services at no cost to the municipalities but is requesting members to be on the committee. Mayor Sutherland announced that Councilman Campbell has volunteered to be on that committee. Council agreed.

f. Neal Blinken offer

Mayor Sutherland reported that Mr. Blinken, developer, has made an offer to the Town of an easement for a curb cut from a piece of property located behind Skyline Road that he will be developing. Mayor Sutherland sent a letter to Mr. Blinken saying thanks but that the Town is not interested.

g. Representative Walter Jones visit

Mayor Sutherland announced that Rep. Jones will be visiting the town (date to be announced) and that the visit will be advertised.

h. Harold Via recognition

Mayor Sutherland announced that in honor of Harold Via's passing the Town proposes to purchase a bench and have it engraved with his name and placed somewhere on town property. Mayor Sutherland stated that Harold Via was very important to the Town. He was one of the original Town Council, fire chief, and did many other volunteer jobs. Mayor Sutherland asked the residents to suggest some places for the bench to be placed.

8. Public Comment-none

9. Council's Agenda

Councilman Denny-none

Pete Macfarlane asked when would Juniper Trail be re-paved? Councilman Denny said not until next spring. Mr. Macfarlane asked if the potholes would be filled? Councilman Denny said that they would be filled very soon and that in the spring Juniper Trail would have a complete rebuild.

Councilman Kennedy asked Mike Hejduk, Code Enforcement Administrator, about the status of the Ginguite Woods construction project? Councilman Kennedy said that he had heard there was a stop work order in place due to a problem with the firewalls. M. Hejduk stated that the stop work order is an issue. He stopped the work at the rough-in inspection due to some details with the fire separation requirements. The engineer is working on this and has submitted details to him today and they are proceeding with the insulation. He also stated that the developer told him the wastewater treatment plant is very close to being approved by the state.

9. Mayor's Agenda

Mayor Sutherland stated that the SSCA newsletter has placed information regarding what residents are to do when Charter Communications (cable) is not providing satisfactory service. He explained that complaints need to be documented and that the Town is keeping a file. He stated that he met with Sam Scialabba, General Manager of Charter and that a synopsis of the meeting would be in the next Town newsletter.

10. Town Manager's Agenda

Tom Gjestson reported that three cars and new portable radios, already approved in the budget, have been ordered for the police department. Two new dual antenna radars have been ordered and will be paid by a state grant.

Tom Gjestson announced that Jennifer Parker, Administrative Assistant for the Police Department, came to the Town over a year ago from Manteo and doing a great job and now is being promoted to a sworn Police Officer. She will maintain most of her current job duties and she will be available in emergency situations.

Councilman Denny asked what level of training she has? Chief Brazell said that Jennifer has her general certification, radar training, DCI and she previously was an officer for Manteo.

Chief Brazell gave the monthly police report.

Charlie Hess, resident, asked if the officer who is on jet ski patrol could be reached while on the water? Chief Brazell said not always, at this time. He stated that radio communication in town is being evaluated and he hopes it will be improved with the new radios.

Town Manager's Agenda cont'd

Jim Conners, SSCA president, asked Chief Brazell what he could tell him about a petition that is being circulating regarding an individual who cross dresses and pops out of other people's property to scare or get attention from passerby's? Chief Brazell explained that this individual has been doing this for several years and can not be stopped since he is not harming himself or anyone else.

He explained that Officer Holland has contacted the Attorney General and was advised if the property owners would sign a petition stating that the individual was trespassing on their property and that they notify the individual of the petition then the property owners could take action by having him arrested.

Councilman Kennedy asked if the individual has been on civic or town property? Chief Brazell said not to his knowledge.

Fire Chief Bakken gave the monthly fire call report. Also he asked that Council include in the Town's newsletter that the public is invited to view the new fire truck and new East station and EMS building and that flu shots would be available again this year, date to be announced.

Mayor Sutherland announced that Jack O'Neal, fireman, was recuperating from a fall sustained while painting the fire station at S. Dogwood.

Tom Gjestson announced that the annual audit is under way and that the Occupancy Tax is up \$30,000 for the last two months.

12. Town Attorney's Agenda-none

13. Announcements

Councilman Denny acknowledged the attendance of Warren Judge, Director of the Dare County Tourist Board, at tonight's meeting. Councilman Denny thanked him and the Board for their help with the grant money for the multi-use path and the millennium fireworks provided to the Town.

Mayor Sutherland announced that this meeting would recess until September 26, 2000 at 9:00 a.m. to consider the amendment of the Town charter to allow election of the mayor by popular vote. Mayor Sutherland commented that there are 19 people here tonight and he hopes more would attend Council meetings. Councilman Kennedy moved to recess the meeting until September 26. Councilman Denny seconded. Approved unanimously.

WHEREAS, the Town Council of the Town of Southern Shores desires to dispose of certain surplus property of the Town;


NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Town Council that:

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PLANNING BOARD MEETING RECAP

8/22/00

Prepared by Jim Morrison for Council Workshop 8/29/00

Two topics took the majority of our time:

1. A request was submitted by Neal Blinken to amend the Zoning Ordinance to permit "group development" (more than one principle building on a lot) as a conditional use in the Commercial zone for parcels exceeding four acres. His belief is that multiple, smaller buildings on a commercial site will be more appealing and attractive to the Town. In order to establish a conditional use, however, the Planning Board must define the conditions that will apply, including: setbacks, separations, size, design attributes, access, buffers, etc., for this new category. In some ways, this is a Planned Unit Development (PUD) for Commercial, with all the attendant requirements and the possibility of phased development. The majority of the members appear to favor the concept; enough to form a study group to work on the conditions which would need to be established to create this new use. Because the ordinance requires that a request to amend must be submitted to Council within 45 days of consideration, there was concern that the formulation and review process may exceed that time. Mr. Blinken withdrew his application in order that the Board could deliberate the matter without a time constraint. Once the study group develops a draft, it may be appropriate to schedule a workshop with Council to discuss this idea in more depth. This ordinance would apply to all parcels in the C District exceeding the size threshold, either now or via lot combinations.
2. Mallard Cove/RS10 issues are still being discussed. We had requested as-built surveys in order to see if a solution to lot setback issues became self-evident. The building inspector has obtained all but 4 as-built surveys, and these 4 may not be available. The surveys disclose some encroachment across lot lines, some encroachment into common areas, and some prior alterations of lot lines to correct problems. Basically, RS-10 requires standard side, rear, and front setbacks but none were applied, lot sizes are below minimum, and the inspections office did not monitor development at the time. One proposal is to simply eliminate all setbacks, and then ask the owners to correct lot problems individually via land transfers. Eliminating setbacks, however, would permit expansion of any of the individual homes to those borders and could increase the overall lot coverage of the development. There are many issues involved, and the next step must include the homeowners' representatives, since up until now this has been an issue driven by the building inspector. The owners are affected because the inspector has determined these are non-conforming properties, they cannot be expanded or rebuilt as now constituted, and that although two renovations which were completed recently had building permits issued at the homeowner's risk, the certificates of occupancy are being withheld by the inspector. This needs to be resolved, but it is evident that some of the homeowners are not aware of the issue, and we are operating in a vacuum as no representatives have attended any of our Planning Board discussions. We hope they will attend our September meeting.
3. Continuing Issues:
  - a. Telecommunications Towers: A draft is in the review stage, and we have scheduled a special meeting for August 29, 7 p.m., to discuss it further.
  - b. Crown Station/Wendys: awaiting a tentative septic permit approval. Kitty Hawk Planning Board is awaiting the result of a traffic consultant who Kitty Hawk has retained to determine internal traffic circulation volumes.

Council Workshop Planning Board Recap

- c. Zoning Ordinance Document: proofing and correction in process. This includes only ordinances passed and in effect since the last document was issued in 1995.
- d. Flood Damage Prevention Ordinance Update: being drafted, to include the current nomenclature for flood zones.
